1 Log in

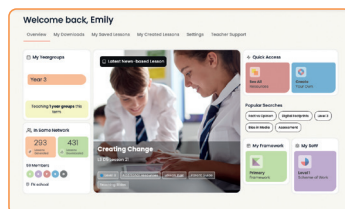
- Click the **profile icon** (top right).
- Sign in with your **email** and **password**.



Sign in to access your TeachKit: MIL resources.

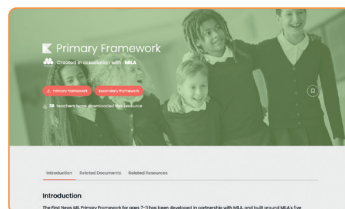
2 Your dashboard

- This is a personalised overview of your account.
- The first time you log in you will be prompted to personalise your dashboard. Set your **year group** in Settings.
- From here you can link to your **framework**, **schemes of work**, the **latest lessons** for your level and the **AI lesson builder**.



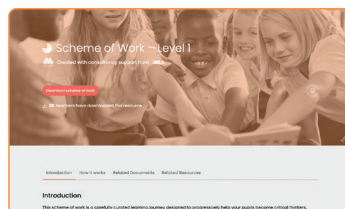
3 Download the Framework

- Click **My Framework** and choose either **Primary** or **Secondary**.
- **Tip:** Toggle between frameworks using the framework cards or buttons.



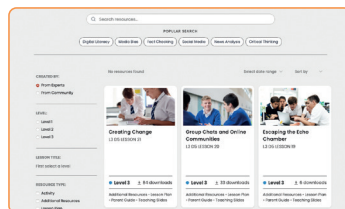
4 Download Scheme of Work (SOW)

- SOWs contain teachable objectives that are mapped to framework statements, to establish a learning journey for progression across all levels.
- Click **Scheme of Work** from your dashboard and choose your level.
- Scroll to **view content** and click download.



5 Expert-written teaching packs

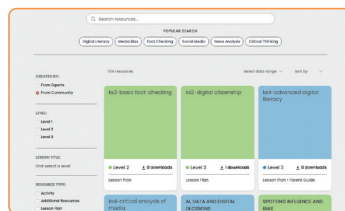
- From your dashboard click **See all resources** or click the current week's **lesson card**.
- You can view resource contents, download individual files or download all (ZIP).
- **Tip:** Use search filters like level, objective, lesson title or theme to find lessons quickly.

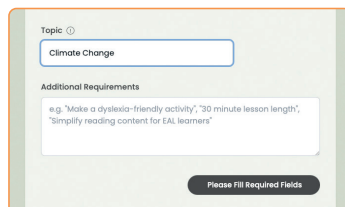
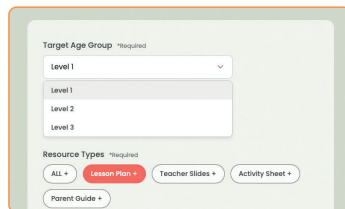
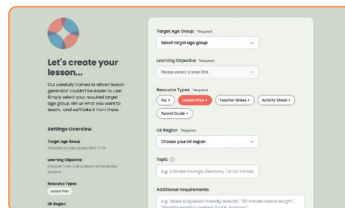
6 Community resources

- Click on the **Community** tab from your dashboard.
- You will find lessons that other teachers have created with the AI tool. Use search filters to find what you need quickly.



7 Create your own

- Click **Create** in the header or the quick link on your dashboard.
- Select **Level**, **Objective** (from SOW) and **UK region** (to localise cross-curricular links).
- Enter **lesson topic** (e.g., "lowering the voting age to 16"), and add any additional requirements (e.g., lesson length, SEND).
- Click **Create**. Wait while the AI generates resources (messages will let you know how it's progressing).
- Review & edit:
 - Approve or request edits in the chat panel eg: provide the entire news article, adjust for lower level readers.
 - Approve lesson plan to generate teachers slides.
 - Approve the slides to generate activities.
 - Approve the activities to generate the parent guide.
 - Select individual files to download or download all (ZIP).



8 How the parts work together

- **Frameworks** outline what it means to be media and information literate as a child.
- **Schemes of Work** three levels (ages 7 – 14), creating a spiral curriculum with progression built in.
- **Dynamic fortnightly lessons** topical, news-linked lessons to keep teaching fresh.
- **Expert-written resource bank** comprehensive expert-written lesson bank, mapped to the framework and regularly updated.
- **AI customisation** create bespoke lessons for pupil ability, SEND needs, lesson lengths or chosen topics.
- **Parent notes** extend learning and conversations beyond the classroom.
- **Community and training** share resources and best practice, building teacher confidence.
